



STAY AT HOME

Wide scale closures, except for critical functions, to reduce hospitalizations and deaths

Gatherings prohibited



SAFER AT HOME

Partial reopening, around 25%-50% with capacity caps, to give public health and health care systems ability to scale their testing, tracing and treatment capabilities.

Small gatherings are okay, but large gatherings are prohibited.



PROTECT OUR NEIGHBORS

Expanded reopening, around 50% without caps, as local outbreaks are managed by strong local systems.

Larger gatherings are okay, but mass gatherings are prohibited until there is a treatment or vaccine.

Families of Park County RE 2,

Thank you for your patience as we have worked to lay out workable, practical, and safe plans for reopening the schools in the fall. We realize how important face to face learning and social contact is to our students, so coming back on campus is extremely important to us. We must pair that with ensuring all staff and students are safe. As you can imagine, this has been a tricky endeavour with constant changes occurring all around us, making a stable plan nearly impossible. We worked with a committee of staff and parents to develop a multi-tiered plan so you as families can be prepared throughout the school year should guidance and executive orders mandate changes.

We have tried to be mindful of all possible situations and the varying levels of concern that exist among us all. Our ultimate goal is to be able to maintain open doors all year unless we are mandated to close. That is the reason for the different levels. We want to be prepared to move to a different level at a moment's notice. By laying out all levels now, families will also know what specific changes to expect if a level change is announced.

You will notice Level 1 is our least restrictive outside of a Level 0 which equates to no changes at all. That would be school as we knew it, last fall. We hope to be back to "normal" someday but are ready to implement any level of this plan at any time depending on restrictions in place at the time of reopening. We will follow the guidance of Public Health throughout the school year and are prepared to move in and out of our levels and modify them as needed. You will notice some environments have "no changes" from Level 1 to Levels 2 & 3. Should we need to move to Level 2, for example, it may require reducing our numbers so procedures won't change but the number of people in an environment will. This may require creating cohorts of students who attend every other day or a modified schedule of some sort.

After you read through the plan, please complete the survey letting us know your educational intentions for each of your children. We will attempt to meet each student's individual need to the best of our ability. We will offer a complete online option. Please know this is very different from "homeschooling". Opting for online learning means you are choosing one of the district's online programs which includes direct contact with a certified teacher, a laptop if needed, continued enrollment with the district, and no cost to you as a family.

Please keep all of this in mind as you read through the plan and know that there are most likely pieces or areas we have overlooked so feel free to contact me if you notice anything we still need to address.

Park County School District Re-2 Return to School Plan for 2020-2021



The Park County School District RE 2 has developed a plan for reopening schools in the fall. The plan accounts for the possibility of changing restrictions that could be put into place at any time throughout the school year. Level 1 was developed with the requirements put out from the Colorado Department of Education, but we developed Level 2 and Level 3 with the anticipation of stricter guidelines being put in place from the state. We want our community to be prepared to move between levels at any moment. There are two levels not mentioned in the plan. Level 0 would be no restrictions at all or school as we knew it last fall. The other is Level 4 which would be closing school and moving to complete remote learning for all. We have broken down the plan into the various environments at school. Some will show no changes in Levels 2 & 3, however keep in mind that we may have to reduce the number of students on campus or in classrooms when moving to those levels so although procedures may not change the number of people in the environment may be reduced.

The options for enrolling your child are on the next few pages, along with a survey that we will use to plan for next year's staffing, transportation, meals, etc. We highly encourage you to read through the descriptions of each environment carefully so you can understand what school will look like for students before making your decision.

This plan may be modified at any time depending on the most current information available.

LEVEL 1

Level 1 outlines the least restrictive environment for our students and staff while following the health orders approved by the local public health department.

LEVEL 2

Level 2 puts more restrictions in place with an emphasis on more social distancing and extra steps in protective measures. This could include reducing our numbers.

LEVEL 3

Level 3 is our most restrictive level outside of a complete shutdown where total remote learning is required. At this level it is most likely numbers will have to be reduced which could result in modified schedules with student cohort groups. Although we hope we don't ever have to move to Level 3, it would at least allow us to keep the doors open.

PRESCHOOL OPTIONS

Parents will be able to register their students for one of the following options:

Reduced Number

1. FULL TIME AT SCHOOL

- Children ages 3-4 can attend school in-person and will be in regular class schedules for the full day
 - Students will remain with their classroom cohort for the day
 - Students will be on the playground one class (cohort group) at a time.
 - Children will have rest time without face coverings and separated from other students

ETE Preschool class sizes are already lower than the State requirements and will continue to run in a safe capacity.

2. PART TIME AT SCHOOL

- Students ages 2.5-4 can attend school in-person for either **morning** or **afternoon** session
- Students will be on the playground one class (cohort group) at a time

Remote Learning

3. REMOTE LEARNING

- Families will be given activities centered around the Colorado State Academic Standards and social emotional development.
- A teacher will meet with parents/students via ZOOM once a week
- Preschool will supply materials that may be needed to complete activities or projects for students each week.

If we are mandated to shut down school for any length of time, all at-school students will move to a remote curriculum provided by preschool teachers and work from home until we are able to safely return.

This will look different than last spring. Staff will have students and families prepared for this possibility from the start of school.

We will stay in constant communication with families if we transition to remote learning.

ETE Options (Kinder-5th Grades)

Parents will be able to register their students for one of the following four options:



ETE Options for the 20-21 School Year

Reduced Number

If we are mandated to reduce class sizes, ETE options will remain the same but with reduced numbers, possibly because some families move to part time or full time at home as needed and able.

There will be no changes for full-time online students.

Remote Learning

If we are mandated to shut down school for any length of time, all at-school students will move to a remote curriculum provided by ETE teachers and work from home until we are able to safely return.

This will look different than last spring. Teachers will have students prepared for this possibility from the start of school, and students will be able to continue working on the grade level content as if they were in school.

There will be no changes for full-time online students.

1. FULL TIME AT SCHOOL

- Grade K-2 students will be in class sizes that are smaller than normal all day long.
 - Students will also be with their classes for Specials, Recess, and Lunch.
 - Students may be pulled individually or with others in their grade level for interventions or special services. (This could be limited to class groups only if further restrictions are put in place.)
- Grade 3-5 students will be in small cohort groups with a homeroom teacher for half the day, and with a “Flip” teacher for the other half.
 - 3rd-5th graders will be 1:1 online with individually assigned laptops.
 - “Flip” time will consist of independent classwork and/or resources assigned by the homeroom teacher done through Google Classroom, as well as some interventions by grade level as needed. (This could be limited to class groups only if further restrictions are put in place.)
 - 3rd-5th graders will have Specials twice each day; once during homeroom, and once during “flip.”
 - Lunch will be with their cohort groups in the Cafetorium or Multi-Purpose Room.

2. PART TIME AT SCHOOL

- Students will do their core curriculum with their homeroom teacher and will be responsible for some independent work to be completed at home each day.
- Teachers will work with students and their families to determine how work will be done (electronically through Google Classroom and/or on paper in their student workbooks).
- Scheduling will be worked out with families by the principal (who will work with teaching teams), to determine whether specials, interventions and special services, lunch, etc. will be included.

3. REMOTE CURRICULUM THROUGH ETE

- Students will be assigned to a homeroom class, but will do all grade level assignments at home.
- Work will be assigned and turned in through Google Classroom and/or through the office when needed.
- Teachers will provide curriculum, resources, videos, and some paper/hard copy materials.
- Teachers will be available during office hours one hour each day.

4. ONLINE CURRICULUM THROUGH EXTERNAL PROVIDER (Families choosing this option need to commit to online learning for the entire school year)

- Students will be enrolled in online courses through accredited online providers and complete all coursework at home. Courses will be selected through Edgenuity based on individual student needs.
- The cost of these courses will be covered entirely by the district and students will remain enrolled as Edith Teter students.
- District staff will assist in course selection, monitor student progress, and help with connecting students to available resources.

Reduced Number

If we are mandated to reduce class sizes, ETE options will remain the same but with reduced numbers, possibly because some families move to part time or full time at home as needed and able.

There will be no changes for full-time online students.

Remote Learning

If we are mandated to shut down school for any length of time, all at-school students will move to a remote curriculum provided by ETE teachers and work from home until we are able to safely return.

This will look different than last spring. Teachers will have students prepared for this possibility from the start of school, and students will be able to continue working on the grade level content as if they were in school.

There will be no changes for full-time online students.

MIDDLE SCHOOL & HIGH SCHOOL OPTIONS (6th-12th Grades)

Parents will be able to register their students for one of the following three options:



South Park Middle School & High School Options for the 20-21 School Year

Reduced Number

If we are mandated to reduce class sizes, the middle school and high school will operate in assigned M/W and T/Th cohort groups.

There will be no changes for full-time online students.

Remote Learning

If we are mandated to shut down school for any length of time, all at-school students will move to a remote curriculum provided by SPMS and SPHS teachers and work from home until we are able to safely return.

This will look different than last spring. Teachers will have students prepared for this possibility from the start of school, and students will be able to continue working on the grade level content as if they were in school.

There will be no changes for full-time online students.

1. FULL TIME AT SCHOOL

- Middle school students (grades 6-8) will be in regular class schedules for the full day
 - Students will be with their grade level cohort for core classes
 - Students will be with mixed grade level groups for electives, lunch, and sports
- High school students (grades 9-12) will be in regular class schedules for the full day
 - Students will follow a personalized schedule that meets their needs and keeps them on track for graduation. Students could be with a mix of high school students throughout the day depending on course selection.

2. PART TIME AT SCHOOL

- Middle school students (grade 6-8) can attend school in-person for their core classes in the **morning** and will have elective opportunities to complete online at home in the afternoons.
- High school students (grades 9-12) can attend school in-person for their core classes in the **afternoon** and will have elective opportunities to complete online at home in the mornings.

3. REMOTE CURRICULUM THROUGH SPMS/SPHS or ONLINE CURRICULUM THROUGH EXTERNAL PROVIDER (Families choosing the external provider option need to commit to online learning for the entire school year)

- Students will be enrolled in courses at SPMS/SPHS or through an accredited online provider and complete all coursework at home.
- External provider courses will be selected through either [EDUCERE](#) or [COLORADO DIGITAL LEARNING SOLUTIONS](#) based on individual student needs.
- The cost of the external courses will be covered entirely by the district and students will remain enrolled as South Park students and continue to work to earn a diploma.
- District staff will assist in course selection, monitor student progress, and help with connecting students to available resources.

INDIVIDUALIZED HYBRID PROGRAMMING

Reduced Number

If we are mandated to reduce class sizes, ETE options will remain the same but with reduced numbers, possibly because some families move to part time or full time at home as needed and able.

There will be no changes for full-time online students.

Remote Learning

If we are mandated to shut down school for any length of time, all at-school students will move to a remote curriculum provided by ETE teachers and work from home until we are able to safely return.

This will look different than last spring. Teachers will have students prepared for this possibility from the start of school, and students will be able to continue working on the grade level content as if they were in school.

There will be no changes for full-time online students.

We are working on a plan for students with an [UNDERLYING MEDICAL CONDITION](#) (or a family member of a person with an underlying medical condition). We need gather more information about the needs in our community, but we hope to include the following:

- One of our experienced teachers will work with students in the administration building, providing a separate entrance and extremely limited exposure to other students and staff.
- Curriculum will be provided by our district teachers and/or one of our external providers.
- The location will have separate spaces, bathrooms, and even separate rooms for students to work in order to limit exposure.
- Our teaching team and district nurse will work with families on an individual basis to develop a hybrid plan to meet students' individual learning needs; plan may include:
 - Full time option with extremely limited group and exposure
 - Part time option where students come in to school for individual tutoring, then complete some assignments at home either online and/or in paper format
- Some additional safety measures not included in the rest of this document, such as having lunch in the classroom, the wearing of masks, and decreased contact time, may be put in place as needed to protect our students in this program due to their increased risk of severe illness.

- Clean the classrooms at the end of the day

- Staff wear face coverings. Students are encouraged to wear face covering. (except outside)
- No masks at nap
- Clean surfaces frequently
- Maintain personal space

 - Shared supplies sanitized between uses

- Students cleaning desks and chairs between classes
 - Teachers clean the door handles frequently

- (All of Level 1 & 2 plus)
- Masks worn in the classroom

LUNCH SERVICE ON CAMPUS



LEVEL 1

- Wash hands before leaving classroom
- Masks while traveling
- 3 people per table (90 max in cafetorium; 102 MPR)
- Disinfecting tables in between classes
- Wash hands upon reentry to classroom
- No parents in lunchroom
- No microwaves available

FOOD SERVICE

- Masks in line
- Cafeteria staff handles trays while filling with food and utensils, then hands to students

- Stay at same desks/use desks for belongings
- Sanitize desks at the end of each group

- If possible, have the same parent drop off and pick up each day
- Adults and students wear masks

STUDENTS OR STAFF WHO GET SICK AT SCHOOL



All Levels

If a student or staff member presents COVID19 symptoms while at school, it will be treated as a COVID19 possibility. The student will be isolated in a designated area and parents must immediately pick up the student. Staff members must immediately go home. The student will need to stay away from school until parents have consulted with and student has been cleared by the school nurse or a doctor or receives a “negative” test result. Similarly, staff members will need to be cleared by the school nurse or a doctor.

CONFIRMED COVID19 CASES



All Levels

Should there be a confirmed case with a student or staff member, the district will immediately shut down the school for a period of time for more intensive disinfecting. During this time, the district will work with Public Health to notify families of close contact exposure and will notify all families of a confirmed case while protecting the confidentiality of individuals involved. Schools will remain closed until cleared for reopening from Public Health. Reopening may occur for some schools before others.
